GM recently announced that it would be introducing a new blue soft top for convertible Corvettes. This picture shows the first 2011 Corvette Grand Sport convertible made with the new Blue soft top (RPO 34T). This 2011 SuperSonic Blue Corvette not only features the first blue convertible top, but also blue accent stitching (RPO 37S) in the interior.

The Blue accent stitching is a \$395 option and is available only on Titanium or Ebony 4LT packages. The accent stitching is a new option for Corvette buyers in 2011.

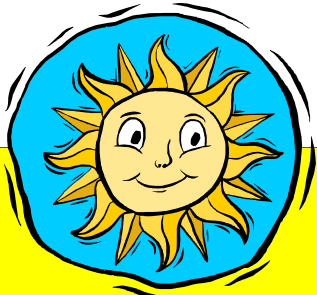

Meeting adjourned at 8:08pm

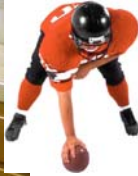
